<i>(Please note: some injuries may not be visible, but may be detectable through forensics.)</i>						
<p><i>Preventative medication should be started ASAP after the assault, preferably within 72 hours although emergency contraception may be taken up to 120 hours after the assault.</i></p> <p><i>If you are concerned about medical care showing up on insurance statements, see our off-campus options which can provide services without insurance.</i></p> <p>Campus Health Check your physical health, check for STIs, offer emergency contraception. <i>Does NOT perform Medical Forensic Exams.</i></p> <p>Off-campus: Planned Parenthood- Margaret Sanger Health Center 520.408.5726</p> <p>Pima County Health Department Theresa Lee Clinic 520.724.7900</p>	<p><i>Evidence should be collected ASAP after an assault, preferably within 72 hours and can be collected up to 120 hours after the assault. A medical exam is strongly recommended if you're considering reporting; however, it does not commit you to reporting to police. The Medical Forensic Exam you receive is at NO COST. However, there may be costs related to the medical care provided by the emergency department staff. These costs may include: labs, X-rays, tests and medications to prevent pregnancy and sexually transmitted infections (STI's), including HIV.
